8. Only use campfires in designated areas
9. Be mindful of others when using speakers or playing music
10. Keep dogs leashed while hiking together.

Water / Towel / Rainwear / Snack / Bag for Trash / Bug Repellant / First Aid Kit / Portable Toilet

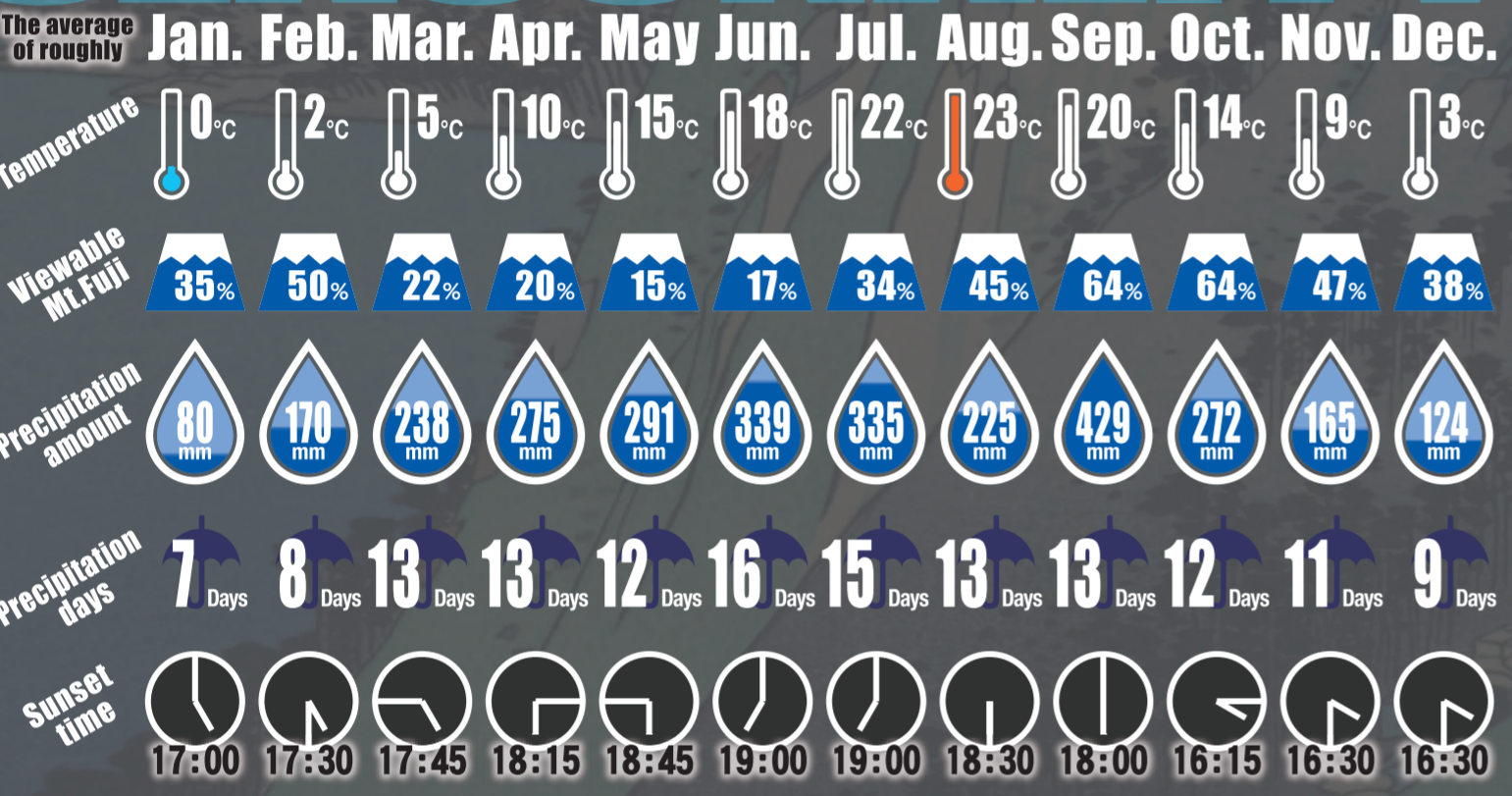

Tokaido Course, History and Culture

DIFFICULTY: Hard
TIME: 150min
DISTANCE: 5.2km (3.2mi)

HIGHLIGHTS: This is one of the most famous roads in all of Japan. Originally used by travelers, samurai, and daimyo going between Edo (Tokyo) and Kyoto. The Tokaido Road has a long history and interesting spots along the way. The trail can also be enjoyed in smaller sections. Starting at the woodcraft village of Hatajuku and walking to Lake Ashi is the best part. See and feel Japanese history.

ACCESS(Bus): Start from Hatajuku Bus Stop → Amazake Teahouse → Old Tokaido Stone Road → Ancient Cedar Path → Hakone Check Point

REMARKS: Between Hakone Check Point and Amazake Teahouse, you can enjoy the atmosphere of the Edo period through the old road (cedar tree, cobblestone) in 2 hours.

Chisuiji Course, Waterfalls and Streams

DIFFICULTY: Easy
TIME: 20min
DISTANCE: 1.2km (0.7mi)

HIGHLIGHTS: The Chisuiji Waterfall is some of the most interesting and impressive waterfalls in this part of Japan. Most waterfalls are known for their height, but these falls are popular because they are wide. The water quietly flows from between two rock layers creating a tranquil and calm space. The waters may look beautiful, but they are not for drinking or swimming. The Chisuiji Waterfall is also a junction point for many hiking trails in the area. It is only a 15 minutes walk up the hill from Kowakien Station on the Hakone Tozan Train line.

ACCESS(Bus or Train): ① Hakone-Yumoto Sta. ② Kowakidani Sta. Walk from Kowakidani Station to Chisuiji Waterfall

ROUTE: ① Hakone-Yumoto Sta. → ② Kowakidani Sta. → Chisuiji Waterfall

Nagao Course, Hakone Crater and Fuji

DIFFICULTY: Hard
TIME: 125min
DISTANCE: 5.1km (3.1mi)

HIGHLIGHTS: Start along the shores of beautiful Lake Ashi and hike up the weathered volcanic crater walls up to a spectacular trail that walks along the volcanic rim with views of Mt. Fuji. You can also get wonderful vistas of the Hakone mountains and Owakudani. This trail will start at the bus stop by the lake and have you end at the convenient bus stop on the mountain.

ACCESS(Bus): Start from Hakone Lake Hotel-mae Bus Stop → Ashinoko Tendou Park → Fujimigakoka Park → Nagao Pass → Fujimida View Point → Mt.Marudake

ROUTE: Start from Hakone Lake Hotel-mae Bus Stop → Ashinoko Tendou Park → Fujimigakoka Park → Nagao Pass → Fujimida View Point → Mt.Marudake

Mt. Kintoki Course, Fuji and Folklore

DIFFICULTY: Medium
TIME: 75min
DISTANCE: 2.1km (1.3mi)

HIGHLIGHTS: Get to one of Japan's best views of Mt. Fuji from Mt. Kintoki, the setting for one of Japan's most beloved children's tales. The Legend of Kintaro is famous throughout Japan. The tale of a boy who grew up in the mountains around the area. Enjoy the lush forests and folk tale settings. Also take in the geological evidence of Hakone's volcanic origins along this route.

ACCESS(Bus): 1. Hakone-Yumoto Sta. 2. Sengekuluss stop No.3. Start from Kintoki-jinja-in-guchi Bus Stop → Kintoki Shrine → Mt. Kintoki

ROUTE: Start from Kintoki-jinja-in-guchi Bus Stop → Kintoki Shrine → Mt. Kintoki
